MISSIONARY CONFERENCE PARTICIPANTS

J.K. & N.K. (ABWE to East Asia) – The Asia and Pacific mission fields are located where 60% of the world population lives, yet where only 27% of missionaries serve. 80% of the world's poorest people reside there. 95% of the world's least evangelized people dwell there, including the top two unreached people groups in the world – Bangladeshis and the Japanese. Most of the world's governments that oppose Christianity are also located there.

Jason & Michelle Maynard (ABWE to Ecuador) – Ecuador is a small nation filled with incredible diversity. Within hours you can travel from Andean peaks to the deep Amazon jungle or find yourself on white sandy beaches of the Pacific coast. Ecuador's people are as diverse as the countryside. With 95% of the population claiming to be Catholic and less than 3 percent following different forms of Protestantism, there is a great need for sound Biblical teaching and church planting.

Doug & Renate Reiner (BMM to Brazil) – Brazil is rapidly changing from a rural nation to an urban one. It is one of the great melting pots of the world but still has large ethnic blocks of European, African and Asian stock. Nearly 42% of Brazil's population is under 15 years old. Another 27% is between 15 and 30. These young people are more receptive to the gospel. Brazil is nominally Roman Catholic. One Roman Catholic authority reported that, although 89 percent of the population claimed to be Roman Catholic, only 10 percent actually practiced their faith. It is estimated that the Protestant community is close to 11 million. The number of spiritists is listed as over 2.5 million.
